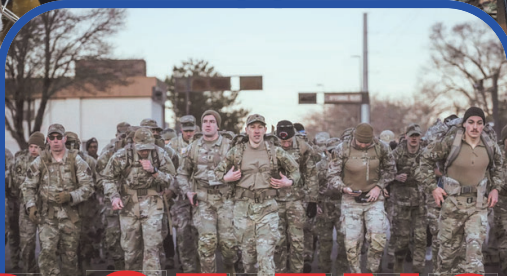

<p>The AFSA Division 6 Past Division President (DPP) Peattie was elected in March 2024 and served until 30 November 2025, due to his permanent change of station to San Antonio, Texas. DPP Peattie focused on Chapter communication, leveraging a WhatsApp chat group for Chapter Presidents (CP) and Chapter Vice Presidents (CVP). He also used the AFSA Division 6 Facebook page for live streams, posting short messages called "Peattie's Perspective." These covered Association news, Division updates, and inspirational words for Chapters and members.</p> <p>DPP Peattie and I (as DVP6) emphasized Division and Chapter administration importance. Notably, Division 6 now has 13 Chapters that are 100% compliant with required documents and contact. We maintain communication with all except three; two of those are scheduled for deactivation and merger in April 2026. Our ongoing contact with the remaining Chapters prioritizes regular, meaningful, and beneficial conversations rather than AFSA business alone. DPP Peattie and I worked with Chapter 1330's interim President to re-establish activity. A significant delay involved the bank account transfer, but appropriate officers now have access and are soliciting nominations for a new Chapter Executive Council (EC) via special election.</p> <p>Chapters 1257 and 1320 continue to exemplify servant leadership through community events supporting military, family, and veteran demographics. Notably, Chapter 1257 successfully challenged the Holloman Air Force Base Command Team to allow food drives as support during the 2025 government shutdown...a tradition that continues today!</p>

<p>Division Vice President (DVP) Bappe assumed the office of President on 1 December 2025. He appointed (with Division EC concurrence) AFSA member Nathan Doebler to fill the Vice President position until the next Division election. DVP Bappe quickly initiated communication via email and Facebook and published two "AFSA Division 6 Flashes" focused on Administrative Support Payment (ASP) and membership policy/procedure updates. One-on-one Chapter communication has been a priority: 100% contact with Chapter Presidents via phone was completed on 2 February 2026. Calls lasted 45–60 minutes and covered Chapter strengths, challenges, and projects. Each President was strongly encouraged to develop program-specific plans (Membership, Communications, Legislation, and Fraternity) aligned with the calendar-year plan, including objectives and milestones.</p> <p>Furthermore, DP Bappe sends bi-weekly emails to Chapter Presidents (each with a special focus) and provides Division membership updates on the 1st and 15th of each month. He conducts weekly check-ins with struggling Chapter leaders for encouragement and mentoring. This year, 13 hours have been dedicated to reconciling the three Chapters with outstanding financial issues. Notably, DP Bappe co-chairs the AFSA International Membership Committee (IMC) with emphasis on training.</p> <p>DP Bappe has also prioritized Division and Chapter fundraising. He authored a community partnership plan titled "AFSA Connect: Communities United." Federal and state tax training was conducted with AFSA Chief of Staff Ms. Juanita Weems; the information helped educate Chapters on leveraging federal EINs and complying with state tax laws. Due to Air Force guidance, government shutdowns, difficulty securing unit-funded attendees, and rising costs, the Division EC has expressed concerns about venue down-payments and financial obligations. DP Bappe and DVP Doebler are emphasizing an in-person Division 6 conference in Las Vegas, Nevada, for 2027. They are researching vendors and mission partners across all membership demographics to energize the event.</p> <p>Since 1 January, Division 6 has hosted four Chapter training sessions: "Chapter Leadership 101," two membership training sessions, and a credentials training session. Attendance ranged from 13 to 28 participants per session.</p> <p>Finally, the Division 6 EC continues planning our annual Summit, scheduled for 28 March via Zoom. This was accomplished through consistent communication of expectations via regional directors, monthly and quarterly reports, and direct email guidance. 

Beyond the financial pressures already affecting many prospective and current members, chapters were impacted by a lack of in-person summits and professional development opportunities, which historically serve as major catalysts for membership engagement, recruiter development, and campaign momentum. The year was further disrupted by the longest government shutdown in U.S. history, which severely limited chapter operations. Many installations restricted access, paused events, or curtailed organizational activities, directly reducing chapters' ability to conduct membership drives, host meetings, or maintain consistent communication with their communities.</p> <p>REGIONAL DIRECTOR EFFORTS: I maintained consistent communication with chapter leaders through monthly emails and Zoom calls. Two chapters remained in good standing throughout the year, and significant effort was dedicated to assisting Chapter 1311, which faced ongoing AA&F financial discrepancies. Throughout CY25, I worked closely with the chapter to identify the issues, provide clear direction for corrective action, and help them progress toward returning to good standing. This process remains ongoing, but the chapter now has a defined and achievable path forward.</p> <p>CY26 OUTLOOK: Presents a renewed opportunity for Division 6 to rebuild momentum and capitalize on the lessons learned from CY25. With in-person professional development opportunities returning, improved training tools in place, and chapters better equipped to conduct targeted membership campaigns, the Division is positioned for meaningful growth. A stronger emphasis will be placed on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reestablishing face-to-face engagement across installations; Strengthening chapter-level retention programs; Enhancing communication pathways between chapters, regional directors, and Division leadership; Leveraging new training products; recognizing high-performing chapters and individuals to reinforce a culture of excellence
